How to Create Safe Spaces in **Early Care & Education** for Children in Immigrant Families



WHAT IS A SAFE SPACE POLICY?

A Safe Space Policy is a formal plan to protect the safety and privacy of children—especially those in mixed-status families—during potential immigration enforcement actions. A Safe Space Policy:

- Clarifies staff roles in emergencies
- Signals your commitment to inclusion
- Reduces fear and confusion
- Builds trust with families

Did you know?

- Nearly half of all children in California are from an immigrant family.
- 1 in 5 lives in a mixedstatus family.

Implementing a Safe Space Policy: Best Practices

- Conduct staff role-play trainings
- · Keep emergency contacts updated
- Share "Know Your Rights" materials with families
- Partner with local rapid response networks

CORE ELEMENTS OF A SAFE SPACE POLICY



Assign Staff Roles

Identify who speaks to law enforcement, who alerts staff, and who contacts legal/community partners.



Designate Private Areas

Mark private areas (e.g., offices, staff lounges). Immigration agents need a valid judicial warrant to enter private spaces.



Interacting with Law Enforcement

Always ask for:

- → Badge & agency ID
- → A valid judicial warrant (signed by a judge—not an administrative warrant).

Maintain Data Privacy

- → Collect only what's needed for enrollment
- → Never share info without consent or a court order



Minimize Disruption

- → Avoid exposing children to law enforcement agents
- → Maintain routines
- → Prioritize emotional safety



Notify Families

After an incident, clearly communicate:

- → What happened
- → How your program responded
- → That families' rights and privacy remain protected

Know Your Rights

→ Fourth Amendment:

Protects against unlawful searches. Agents need a valid judicial warrant to enter private areas.

→ Fifth Amendment:

You have the right to remain silent. Staff do not have to share information without proper legal documentation.
